


1-in-5 UK adults (working age) consider HOSPITALITY to be an appealing industry to work in.

Hospitality is considered an appealing industry to work in by 21% of UK workers. This is on par with education, healthcare, art & entertainment and financial services. Those who have ever worked in hospitality are much more complementary, with 28% viewing it as an appealing industry vs 14% for non-hospitality workers. Over 55 year olds see it as a much less appealing industry compared with younger workers.

It follows that those over 55yrs simply see Hospitality as a less credible career; only 29% of over 55 year olds would be pleased if a young family member wanted a career in the industry. Those who have never worked in the hospitality industry have a lower opinion of it as a potential career suggesting the issue is perhaps one of perception over reality.

What is the current perception of Hospitality as a career choice?

Hospitality industry NPS = -49 -35 from hospitality workers -60 from non-hospitality workers

UK adults were asked to rate how likely they would be to recommend a career in the Hospitality industry to friends/family. A minus score shows that the majority of people do not feel positively about working within hospitality. Above 'O' is considered 'positive'.
